This report will summarize the ups and downs, ins and outs of the NM legislative process with a special eye to legislation impacting Medicine.

The <u>Senate</u> and the newly elected, reconfigured <u>House</u> have assigned committees.

Bill: Sponsors: Title: Summary:	HB52 Espinoza (R59) HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER COMPETITION RESTRICTIONS VOID IN LEA, CHAVES, OR EDDY COUNTY (Related to 2014 SB46; similar to 2013 SB608 and 2013 HB642) Limits enforceability of contractual conditions involving certain healthcare professionals who are under contract to health businesses. Declares a noncompete provision void in a contract that restricts the right of a health care professional to provide health care services in Lea, Chaves or Lea County when the contract is terminated. All other provisions of the agreement, including payment of damages reasonably related to the injury suffered by reason of the agreement termination, shall be enforceable.

Summary:	(Related to 2014 HB143, HJM9, HM28, SB14, SB58, SB76, SB329) Requires that a member or licensee of a health profession licensing board who seeks a change in the scope of practice shall request a hearing from that board on the matter. The board shall collect data, make a technical assessment of the proposed change and report its analysis, conclusions and recommendations to the New Mexico Legislative Council. The council shall assign the proposed change to a committee for its review and shall report on its assessment, analysis and recommendations to the Legislature.

Private insurance may not be provided to a beneficiary for health care that is covered by the plan; however a beneficiary may purchase private, supplemental benefits and insurance for benefits not covered under the plan.
