<b>HB65</b>	<p><b>PATIENT SAFE STAFFING ACT</b></p> <p>Synopsis: House Bill 65 (HB 65) enacts the Patient Safe Staffing Act that requires hospitals to establish staffing levels for hospital nursing units. It gives a nurse the right to refuse an assignment under certain circumstances. HB 65 requires hospitals to post and report their daily hospital nursing unit patient census and staffing levels. It makes the Department of Health (DOH) responsible for posting hospital reports on its departmental website for consumers. HB 65 authorizes the DOH to enforce compliance with the Patient Safe Staffing Act through penalties and corrective action and to promulgate rules to implement the Patient Safe Staffing Act.
