


With amendments to New Mexico's Electronic Medical Record Act in 2021, SYNCRONYS can operate without


NETWORKS FOR HEALTH


BENEFITS OF USING POPULATION HEALTH DASHBOARD

Risk Models can help identify:


- Members expected to have high cost and utilization (ED/IP) who may benefit from care management.
- Members at increased risk for specific chronic conditions and events, enabling preventive interventions.
- Members at increased risk for inpatient readmission or ED revisit within 30 days to prioritize transitions of care support.
- Groups of patients needing care management.
- Gaps in care to be addressed for individual patients to improve HEDIS measure scores.












































TURQUOISE CARE

- The new Turquoise Care Medicaid Program goes into effect July 1, 2024
- The Human Services
 Department has identified
 HIT and HIE requirements
 for the MCO's and their
 provider networks
- The MCO (CONTRACTOR) shall accelerate statewide HIE participation by all Medicaid Providers and Turquoise Care MCOs by:
- Requiring that Behavioral Health and Physical Health Providers use the HIE for the secure sharing of clinical information between Physical and Behavioral Health Providers;
- Ensuring Providers utilize alerts to facilitate timely follow up with Members after admission or discharge from hospitals and emergency rooms;



TURQUOISE CARE

- The MCO shall collaborate with HCA and the HIE to support projects and initiatives in areas where HIT and HIE can bring significant change and progress, including efforts focused on:
- Coordinating the secure sharing of clinical health information between Providers and across the continuum of care.
- Other activities as identified by HCA and that are allowed under the Permitted Use Policy of the HIE.
- To increase the number of Providers participating in the HIE, the MCO shall develop, with the HIE, a recruitment plan that can achieve an increase in the number of Providers that join the HIE.
